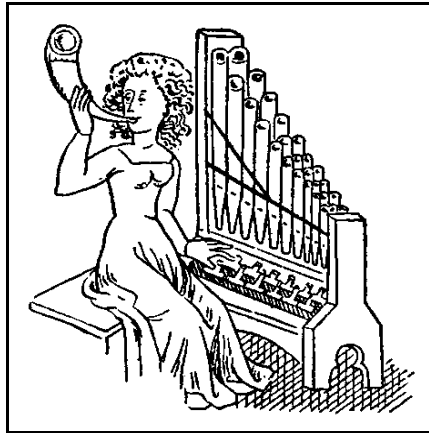

## + Pr. André ~ Change

Grace and peace to you.

Some weeks ago, Anne and I heard a talk given by Dr. Bob Kelly. "I'm trying to think of some churches that actually *like* change", he intoned. (There was a long pause as he stroked his beard as if giving the question some serious thought.) "Nope", he said... Can't think of any."

Our national church has adopted a new *Social Statement on Human Sexuality* and a number of related policies. The marriage of gay folks is now permitted in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada on the same basis as it is for straight folks. Same thing for ordination. For some, these will appear to be significant changes. At Trinity, the truth is that we've been contemplating these matters since the 1990's and the Eastern Synod has been moving in this direction for several years. The fact that our national church would follow suit comes as no great surprise.



At the same time, our parish is going through a significant change in leadership as Gywin relinquishes her present role to become *Emerita Director of Music*. It's been 50 years since the last change at the helm. In some regards, this is the more profound transition on Trinity's horizon. The impact will be apparent to everyone beginning in September. For my part, no more looking up to the loft early on a Sunday to say "Good morning, Mrs. Murray." No more telegraphing an impending funeral with a best-guess phone call as to date and time. No more early-year lists of who's getting married and when. No more...

In many ways, while the full inclusion of gays and lesbians in the life of the church will yield a more completely realized expression of Trinity's welcome for all of God's children, Gywin's retirement touches our community more broadly, touches us deeply, and touches close to home. How many Sundays, Good Fridays and Christmas Eves has Gywin shared with us? ...weddings? ...funerals? ...choir rehearsals? ...special occasions? Thousands!

No one, in any leadership capacity, has had a more profound impact on the shape and direction of Trinity's ministry for the last half century. No one.

For Gywin's service to the church, for her friendship and collegiality, and for her grace in a time of great personal transition, we do well to be thankful. For my part, I am very, very grateful.

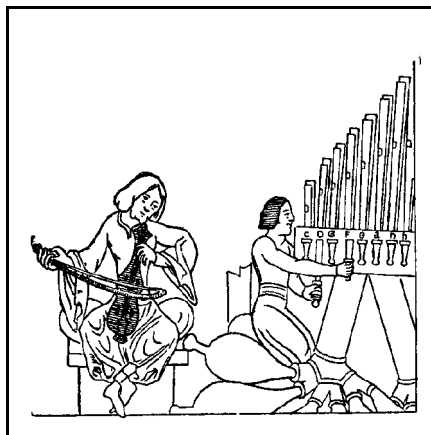

So... Who will *you* invite? I have someone in mind...

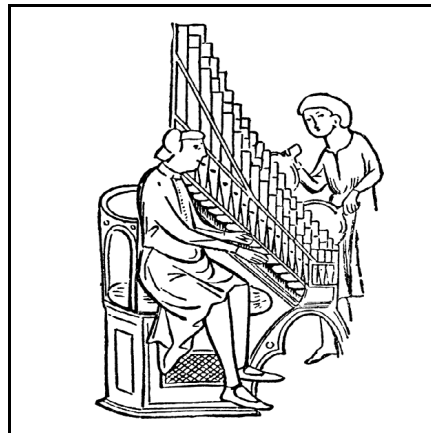

## + ELCIC National Convention

Our National Convention unfolded in July in Saskatoon. Pastor Anne was a delegate while I provided staff support. There were three important decisions, among many others. (Complete details are carried at [www.elcic.ca](http://www.elcic.ca).)

1. Bishop Susan Johnson was re-elected and will lead a National Church Council with many new faces.
2. The ELCIC adopted a *Social Statement on Human Sexuality* and three related policy motions which (1) speak to the unity of the church and will permit (2) the marriage of gay and lesbian persons and (3) the ordination and call of gay and lesbian persons in committed relationships. Please see the documents posted on our website together with the enclosed pastoral letter.
3. The convention opened the door to a several-year structural renewal process. Enabling resolutions will come before our Synod assembly next summer. Our future church will likely be composed of three synods of equal size (instead of 5); will gather synodically and nationally every three years (instead of 2); and will have a smaller national convention composed of 150 delegates (instead of 350+) elected at the synod conventions.

## + Financial Update to July 31, 2011

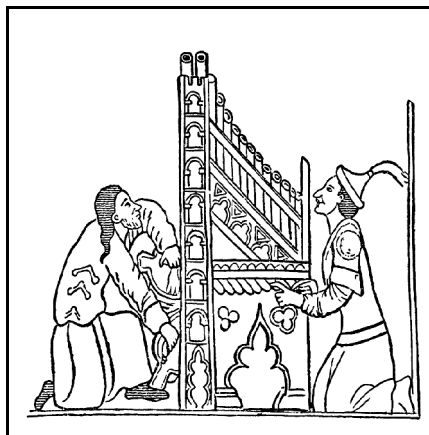

### Overview

Our General Fund shows a continuing deficit although our expenditures are well within budget.

Our Capital Fund is in good shape but will be severely depleted (as will the opening balance of \$23,737) when work on the roof (about \$29,000) and the installation of a new phone system (about \$4,400) are taken into account.

Our Transfers include over \$10,000 for the terrific Gywin Murray Church Music Scholarship to be administered by the Eastern Synod.

## + Property Matters

We've been busy!

At the Wilmot Street Parsonage, the fully insulated basement has been dry-walled making for a more useful and hospital space and one that is much cheaper to heat.

At Peel Street, new carpeting has been applied in the bedrooms and family room; tile has been applied in the front hall, office, kitchen and laundry room; additional carpeting in the upper hall and staircase will be completed in September; a new sink was installed in the lower washroom and remedial work was done on the walls in the storage room leading to the attic.

In the church, small exterior brick repairs were made to the 1983 wing; the time capsule was enclosed; a new sill was set into the main entrance and a window sill was replaced in the day-care room overlooking the courtyard; the new phone system will be installed shortly.

Three new flat roofs will soon cover the 1983 and 1991 wings at the church. The Property team is also looking at a new back door for the church and a couple of exterior doors for the Peel Street parsonage.
