## + Pastor Anne ~ Spirituality

Grace and peace to you.

I just returned from a conference called CANLEAD FORUM, a forum on youth, leadership and worship in our context today. I have so many great things moving around in my head. The one I would like to share with you in this article is the importance of spiritual practice in our everyday life.

I attended a workshop led by Maya Landell, a United Church pastor who has worked in youth and camping ministry for many years. Her workshop focused on encouraging spiritual practices with young people and children.

Maya spoke about spiritual practices like prayer, reflection on the Scriptures and interactive ways to reflect on our faith. Some of the ideas that we tried out in her workshop included writing, reading, a prayer labyrinth, use of physical elements such as candles, water and music. I have many new ideas which I am anxious to try out with our youth and in our Sanctuary community.

The most important thing I took from her workshop is the significance of sharing our faith and faith practices with younger generations. She told the story of a pastor-friend with a youth member who was overseas, stationed with the armed forces in a war zone. This young person had written a post card to his pastor and spoke of how frightened he was and how it was hard to speak to anyone about it. The pastor's first thoughts were ...have I shared with him how he is never alone? ... have we talked about the gift we have in prayer and the ways it can be expressed? Our faith practices, like prayer, are important.

Perhaps that is not an every-day example but there are many moments when I have that same thought: have we talked about the love and presence of God and the gift of prayer and reflection that we have at hand?

Our tradition is rich with possibility and hope. Over the next little while we have two possibilities which may be helpful to our community as we reflect together in our faithful journey.

First, each week we will be taking a few paragraphs from Luther's *Small Catechism* to focus on at worship. We'll begin with the Ten Commandments on Lent 1, and continue with the Four Gospels and Creed on Lent 2, the Lord's prayer on Lent 3, and so on. We'll have a great opportunity to really explore who we are as a faithful people in a different way.



Second, we will begin a casual monthly small gathering called *Open Table* where we will be exploring some of our spiritual reality and practices.

For the first three gatherings (March 3, April 7 & May 5) we will offer a DVD-based conversation called "Convergence: Where Faith and Life Meet. See [allthingsconverge.com](http://allthingsconverge.com).

My hope is that, as we make our way through the highs and lows of our faithful journey together, we will have a chance to explore ways to express and reflect on our own particular place in that journey. I trust that we can explore some new and creative ways to share and live out the love of Christ that gives us so much hope.

For many years, I have edited a series of essays —Some 150 to date!— which Pastor Paul Bosch publishes at [www.worship.ca](http://www.worship.ca). The series is called *Worship Workbench* and “offers practical teaching about Christian worship and the preparation of liturgy”. Recently, Pastor Bosch began a new series of essays on *The Scrutinies: The Catechism for Public Worship in Lent and Easter*. See the piece on pages 4 and 5, following.



This Lent, we will take up Pastor Bosch's suggestion of focusing on Martin Luther's *Small Catechism* as part of our Lenten devotion. It will come to life as a regular feature of our Anchor Community worship on the Five Sundays in Lent and on Palm Sunday. We'll call it “Praying the Catechism”, a title born of the thoughts of Paul Bosch and the title of a book by Pastor Don Johnson, one which we have often commended to new members. ## ✦ Spirituality ~ Praying the Catechism

The following is adapted from the first in a series of six Paul Bosch essays called *The Scrutinies: The Catechism for Public Worship in Lent and Easter*. The essays are published as part of the *Worship Workbench* series at *Lift Up Your Hearts*, [www.telc.ca](http://www.telc.ca). We plan to use Paul's material for our Anchor Community worship during Lent.

### The Catechism for Public Worship

In the days immediately after the Second Vatican Council, many Christian denominations became excited by new possibilities for the formation of adults coming to baptism for the first time. The late Twentieth Century seemed to many to bear more resemblance to the first four centuries of Christian history than to the seventeen centuries since Constantine. Living as we do today in a post-Christendom era, it was argued, what the churches need now are ways to cultivate new generations of adult disciples.



This new awareness took a variety of shapes in different churches. In Roman Catholicism, a catechetical program and a Rite for the Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) was developed. Other churches preferred the term “formation” to “initiation”. But almost every church began to take seriously the needs of an adult catechumenate, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada among them. The *Lutheran Book of Worship* was developed in the early ‘Seventies as a North American Lutheran response to the needs of adult candidates for baptism — among other motives. Today’s *Evangelical Lutheran Worship* enlarges that vision. See *ELWorship*, pages 225-244.

Among us, Luther’s *Small Catechism* has for generations been the major teaching tool in instructing catechumens, usually assumed to be pre-teens. But many in these days are coming to faith as full adults. ELCIC Pastor Don Johnson provided a marvelous gift to our churches when in 1995 he published *Praying the Catechism*. Don intended his little book as a devotional guide for use in the home, by individuals and families. But I can envision its use also in corporate worship.

And thirty years ago I adapted for my own campus ministry congregation a similar use of the *Small Catechism* in Sunday worship.

My efforts at that time were inspired by Lutheran liturgical theologian Frank Senn — another mentor of mine whose writing and teaching represent also one of North American Lutheranism’s finest gifts to the ecumenical treasury.

Frank noted, in an occasional periodical called *The Circle*, a Medieval practice of providing, within the Sunday Eucharist during Lent, a series of brief catechetical moments called The Rites of the Scrutinies.

So I beg your indulgence, faithful reader, in interrupting my series on *A Customary...* with a kind of mini-series on catechetical instruction within worship. I shamelessly borrow Don’s insights for this mini series, and I shamelessly borrow from Frank’s presentation of some of the language from the Medieval Scrutinies, with gracious thanks to both of these creative and inspiring mentors and teachers.

I’m aware that my own version of the Scrutinies that follow represents a catechetical approach that’s foreign to the Scrutinies of old — and indeed foreign to their current use in the RCIA. These were both precisely not so much catechetical in intent, but more concerned with forming personal and corporate Christian piety. But Lutherans — including this Lutheran! — can barely address piety without reference to the Catechism!

So what follows below is my own adaptation of Frank’s work in *The Circle*, which I published, in an alternate form, in *The Paschal Cycle* (Concordia Publishing House, St.Louis, MO, 1980).

My idea — neither Don nor Frank need endorse what follows, but I hope I’m not too far from the spirit of both — is that the following brief Rites be used during the seasons of Lent and Easter within the context of Sunday morning’s worship in a regular parish setting. You could call them “Praying the Catechism”; You could call them “Scrutinies”; You can perhaps suggest a better set of titles.

I’ll provide six of them over the coming weeks, incorporating as they do the six parts of Luther’s *Small Catechism*. They could be used within worship on each of the Sundays in Lent; Perhaps better advice would be to use the first three during Lent, and the last three during Easter, following the ancient custom of post-Easter *mystagogia*, or instruction for the newly-baptized in the meanings of Christian worship.

Before we begin, a word of caution. Luther’s language is not inclusive. God is a “he” in the *Small Catechism*. As well, Luther participates, understandably enough, in the assumptions of his own era. When he interprets the Ten Commandments, for example, he speaks of the “wrath” of God and God’s “punishing” all who disobey: See his language on the bottom of page 1161 in *ELWorship*. Prudent pastors will want to translate and interpret such passages for modern congregations, or perhaps omit these

passages altogether in any print piece — as Don does!

With that caveat, I present here six “Scrutinies” for use in your assembly’s worship during Lent and Easter.

I’d insert them in the Holy Communion just after the Hymn of the Day. And I’d keep the sermon brief on that day! In the best circumstances, I’d do without a print piece altogether, since Pastor and Assisting Ministers pray all the prayers, and the people have *ELWorship* for the texts of the *Small Catechism*, pages 1160-1169. You might want to enlist several voices to speak at (A). And could some sort of visual aids be useful in communicating certain of the meanings explored here? I’ll leave that possibility to your own imagination...

## ✝ January Council News

- Every month, Council sends a number of thank-you notes to people named in the pastors’ report and elsewhere. This month, we thanked Harold Remus (adult learning), Ken/Judie Seltzer (hosts for Council’s Epiphany gathering), Emma & Caroline Wiechers & Tara Otto (Directors of our Faith Adventures Christmas program), Judy Riley (cleaning staff), Jessie Junker (children’s soft worship bags).

- Our new Parish Visitation Team is coming together and will grow with time. We shall bless God for their ministry at our Anchor Community worship on February 14.

- Open Table will replace Third Thursdays at Meme’s (TT@MM) beginning March 3.

- Beginning in March, Pastor André will begin a 6-session Council study on Lutheran worship: How did we get where we are? Why do we do what we do?

- Council heard that we ended the year in good financial shape with surpluses in the General and Capital Funds, a broad schedule of work done beyond the congregation, and great results from our having transferred our Endowment Fund to the care of ELFEC.

- A schedule of Judy Riley’s work in connection with cleaning the church was reviewed. Her tremendous flexibility and the great rapport with her staff were noted. Her very reasonable rates are greatly appreciated.

- Some years ago, Council adopted a process called “recruiting to position” to fill Council vacancies. To the extent possible, Council seeks to match peoples’ particular gifts and skills with our projected ministry needs. As a result, we have a full slate to recommend to the annual

meeting. Serving or willing to serve are Lori Arnott, Marcus Buehlow, Krista Durrer, Larry Gravill, Doreen Lindner-Baan, Doug Miller, Chris Normandeau, Cy Ridout, Rick Ritz, Pat Schmetzer, Ken Seltzer and Heidi Ziegler.

- Council reviewed and approved a third draft of Trinity’s 2010 program budget to take to the annual meeting. The budget is published in the *Bulletin of Annual Reports* two weeks before the meeting.

- Council was brought up to steam on Bishop Johnson’s invitation to Pastor André to serve on the ELCIC staff as Assistant to the Bishop for Ecumenical Relations. We began to explore the possibilities and implications of a partnership with the national church around a deployed staff position. Council members were invited to contemplate any “questions you believe Trinity’s people might be asking about the ELCIC proposal.” The results were compiled and information has been gathered. The idea was to make sure that we came to the annual meeting prepared. The results are published in the *Bulletin of Annual Reports*.

Council adopted the following motion: “Council enthusiastically endorses the proposal from the National Church to share Pastor André Lavergne, and we commend it to the Congregation.”

## + CLWR's Terrific Partnership

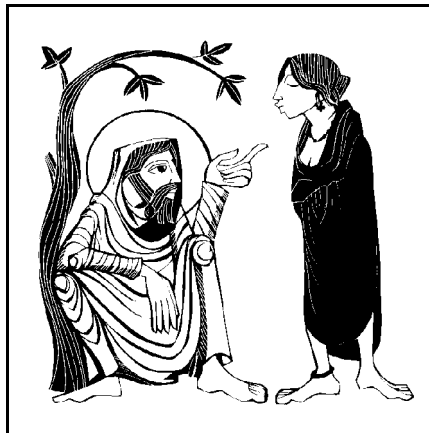

## + Property Matters

### Energy Conservation & Comfort III

Last fall, we listed a number of energy conservation and comfort items being undertaken at the parsonages. So far... The Peel and Wilmot Street attics have been insulated and the access hatches built-up / sealed. The Peel Street water heater has been replaced with a high-efficiency unit. Windows at Wilmot Street have been replaced.

Work has been completed to relocate the Wilmot Street water softener and the cistern has been demolished in preparation for the application of basement insulation and the installation of a new furnace and air conditioner. Replacement of toilets with low-flush models is under way. All of this work will attract substantial energy-related rebates and will be covered by 2009 Capital Fund receipts.

### Main Church Work

We were unable to complete the installation of a tank / pump assembly to evacuate kitchen waste as there is not enough room between the joists. Instead, a new sealed lid has been applied. So far, no smell!
