## + Pastor Anne ~ Let's Celebrate!

Grace and peace to you.

You've read it here and heard it many times at worship in recent weeks: "We have much to celebrate at Trinity Church!" So... Let's celebrate!

I think the following is true: there are moments and events in life that we might think of as *resurrection moments*—times which, despite any hardships and darkness we may experience, give us light and life and encourage us to keep on going. I hold these *resurrection moments* dear. Perhaps you do too!

We are just getting ready to celebrate Millie Faruzel's life. I have a letter from Pastor André which I will read at worship. A lunch brigade is pulling things together behind the scenes. Yes, there are many moments of resurrection to celebrate here at Trinity. It is my prayer that we will hold tight to the hope we have been given in Jesus and celebrate fully the life we have been given in this community.

Let us give thanks for our faithful journey together.

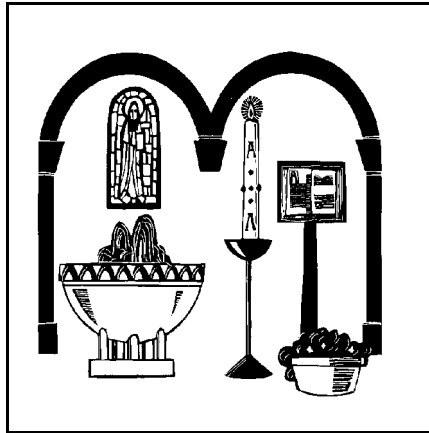

## ✦ Sabbath Blessing

*We are grateful to Molly Wolff for her kindness in making the gentle voice of Sabbath Blessings available to a wide following in the electronic and print media.*

### Four Things

The younger kid and I went down to Toronto for a tourist-y weekend, taken in conjunction with the older kid and his partner, my other-daughter. We spent much of our time in two prime exhibition spots: the Ontario Science Centre and the Royal Ontario Museum, invariably known as the ROM. I also went to church this Sunday morning at my other-daughter's nosebleed-high Anglican parish, St. Mary Magdalen's (aka St. Mary Mag's), Healey Willan's long-time church, possessing the best church choir in Canada. Not my judgment: the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation's verdict.

Okay. That was the informational set-up. Out of this visit, four things emerged:

The ROM is putting on the first Canadian exhibition of the Dead Sea Scrolls. I have now leaned elbows over a display case showing the exquisitely scribed fragments, put together like a jigsaw puzzle with missing pieces, of a psalm dating back maybe two millennia, to the dry lands whereupon our Lord walked with his calloused humble human feet. The delicacy and beauty of the script clobbered me far more than any historical or theological element. I assorted this with the equally exquisite scribing of a Qu'ran, an early medieval New Testament, and an ancient Egyptian text (the ROM is nothing if not eclectic).

I associated it with all the human beauty of extraordinary craft, stuff we in the early 21st century simply don't get — how intelligent, patient, perfectionist, devoted, passionate, our ancestors were about stuff we take contemptuously for granted, like the brocading of a length of 18th-century silk, the turning of Venetian glass, the precise strokes of a brush or pen. How beauty is rooted in the human soul. How the scribe, the weaver, the embroiderer, the maker, spends time, takes time, tunes experience and craft, to something extraordinarily important. We've forgotten this.

That beauty, that perfectionism, that care and passion, were in the music I heard at St. Mary Mag's this morning — music and liturgy dedicated to excellence and solemnity and beauty of a high order. The church itself is quite plain — nothing fancy in the way of decoration or glass. No; it's sunk all its emotional and spiritual energy into liturgy and music, which it does supremely well and in complete devotion. And that too was deeply admirable.

But the Science Centre and the ROM also gave me two wild, unmediated, not-human gifts, the other two of the four.

The Science Centre had a series of photos from the Hubble space telescope: five images in colour of galaxies and nebulae, of swirling masses of billions and billions of stars, from infant to dying, clouds of interstellar gas — amazing images, wild and free. And there was a tidy diagram showing how it all starts from the point of the Big Bang.

I know that an in-depth awareness of the vastness of the universe is supposed to make us feel insignificant and unimportant. The blessedness of faith is to be able to say "Woohoo! God made all these stars in their vastness and glory, and God also made the ants' nest in the rain forest exhibit of the Science Centre, not far from the Burmese python, and I stand between the two, wholly known and wholly loved, as are the ants and the galaxies and the python, because God is very, very, unimaginably large Love."

The ROM, meanwhile, had an astonishing exhibition of minerals: a gazillion (it felt like) cut, uncut, lumpish, polished, honest and dressed-up variations on primal elements and what nature had done to them: in vivid colour. The beauty was extraordinary, far more searching and intense than the human-made jewelry in a nearby gallery. It was also playful. I thought of the line from Psalm 104 about Leviathan, whom God made "for the sport of it". Yes, I understand the science — how amethyst geodes come to be, how colouring elements create blues and greens, sharp yellow, rich reds. I do get it. But it still feels as though these things come into being "for the sport of it."

Which convinces me more, the human-mediated spirituality of the scrolls and the solemn eucharist, or the wilder, wider creativity of the nebulae and the geodes? I have to vote for the latter, for myself — not for anyone else. This is a personal thing. I have been deceived too often and too deeply by piety; I prefer to range free, trailing my fingers through Creation in search of the Creator, because to me, the ultimate theological question is the Problem of Creation.

What stands before that point on the tidy diagram, that instant before the Big Bang? What causes minerals to crystalize in what we see as extraordinary beauty — beauty we can strain at but not ultimately own? (Although the straining-at, as in the Scrolls and the liturgy, is where we grow our souls.)

But our mileage will vary. That's a given.

## ✦ Stewardship Task Group Update

### Dean Clarke on the Trinity Family

In his September 27 Adult Learning session, Dean Clarke spoke on the family dimension of stewardship. At the conclusion of his presentation, he invited participants to offer their own impressions of the Trinity family and its stewardship. Neil Klaassen asked that the results be posted in the Katie Luther Room. They were... and now they're available here, too!

### Compassion

Examples at Home - care for aging parents; "Hospice" caring for my dying mother; visiting people in the hospital; responsibility of parents: big task

Examples at Church - church family supports the sick, injured & suffering; strength and comfort: before/during/after death of loved one; we witness the professionalism of our pastors and how they care for their congregation; Caring Conversations: "All are welcome here."; Sincerity of the question "How are you?"; church's willingness to let other services use our facilities (A/A, Daycare...); compassion for parents, kids having issues at home; finding ways to take the pressure off.



### Hard Work

Examples at Home - parents lead by example; expectations: help in household chores; attention to homework a priority; cleaning house for grandparents/relatives; helping to build shed for neighbour; teamwork; everyday living with "Ernie".

Examples at Church - Work Days in spring & fall; washing dishes after church meals; painting/decorating for Faith Adventures; Film Festivals with Sherry; presentations; property care; choir prep.; consistency with volunteers.

### Social Skills

Examples at Home - interaction between siblings, parents, extended family & friends; skills learned at school; skills learned on sport teams; skills learned at dance, piano, singing and guitar lessons; dealing with anger, disappointment, grief; learn how to wash dishes & do housework; playing board games; dealing with conflict: unconditional love, bullying; learning hospitality.

Examples at Church - early interaction with wide variety of people; singing in choirs & doing solos; acolyte ministry; Assisting Ministers; parts in church plays; Camp Edgewood; Pitch and Praise; TYGers; arts and crafts in

Sunday School; Faith and Film Program; coffee/caring time.

### Charity

Examples at Home - taking meals to sick or grieving families; donations to charities; parents volunteer for Sunday School/sports activities, driving; volunteering for charitable communities: "Ride N Stride"

Examples at Church - Helping at funeral lunches with baking/serving; church offerings; Sunday School offerings; Dave Mello's coffee, food, flowers, snacks, photos; Church Council members; Sunday School teachers & helpers; greeters/ushers; choir director, singers; collection counters; dinner for Jamaican workers; mitten, scarf and hat knitters; Christmas gifts for less fortunate; food hampers.

### Respect

Examples at Home - lead by example: seeing how parents respect their parents; kids learn to respect parents & grandparents; respect at schools: don't

discuss teacher faults in front of children; respect children's ideas.

Examples at Church - choirs respect Mrs. Murray (or else...); children learn to respect Sunday School teachers; children learn respect of elders: interact with parents and other members of the church; sharing the Peace with our neighbours; mentor program: children matched with adults; respect for pastors; respect for church property; respect for tradition while open to change; respect other faiths; learning about other religions.

### Family Values: Love

Examples at home - hugs, kisses, verbal "I love you"; love share amongst family relatives; comfortable love, not chastised; music together; patience; tough love: "new puppy"; care, compassion, deeds done; unconditional love; TLC; discipline

Examples at Church - Friends helping new mothers have a break; holding babies; weddings; commitment to love: "...greatest of these is love"; choir singing at funerals; baptismal sponsors; Ten Commandments; love your neighbour; "God so loved the world"; soup & casserole brigade; prayer shawls; lunch at funerals; visitations; shepherds; prayers and pray-ers; Faith Adventures teachers; transportation; supportive staff.

Every month, Council sends a number of thank-you notes to people named in the pastors' report. This month, we thanked the ELW for their sponsorship of the 100-Mile Diet Lunch; Buck and Cy for their work on our 175<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Photo Album project; and the Faith Adventures Team for their wonderful preparation for our fall ministry.

- Council adopted a 2010 Budget Preparation Process prepared by Rick Ritz. Members of the congregation are invited to communicate any needs or concerns to the respective portfolio liaison people on Council.

- Pastor Anne circulated a Pastoral Response to the H1N1 pandemic. The response was endorsed by Council and will be modified on the basis of any new information circulated by Public Health.
