+ Pr. Anne ~ Promises, Promises.

Grace to you and peace.

"What does this mean?" That's a question which Luther repeats again and again to introduce his bits of teaching in his SMALL CATECHISM. The original German is "Was ist das?" which properly translated is "What is this?" The German has a kind of directness to it, not unfamiliar to our youth and the way they talk. Our confirmands might well sharpen things a little bit and ask something like "So... What's the point?"

That's a question we spend many Saturdays, and a couple of weeks at Affirmation camp, reflecting on as we journey together through our Affirmation ministry program. What's the point? What's the point of confirmation?

Well, it's about promises. Promises that they make; promises that we make. Affirmation of Baptism and confirmation are about promises. It's a two-way street. They make promises; we make promises. We all make promises. Check out the service, EVANGELICAL LUTHERAN WORSHIP, pages 234-237.

Just as I remind our youth before confirmation, I thought it might not be a bad idea to review some of the promises made in any Affirmation of Baptism. When our confirmands stand before us and say "yes" to God's call, we, in turn, promise to support them in the same journey we undertook when we were baptized.

Confirmands promise to **live** among God's faithful people. They, as we, come to be a part of the body of Christ whether at church or wherever the faithful gather.

Confirmands promise to **hear** the word of God and share in the Lord's supper. We hear the gospel in the words of scripture and in a message which proclaims God's good news of forgiveness and love. We then choose to live out that message in the sharing of bread and wine.

Confirmands promise to **proclaim** that same message to those around us —a message of love and acceptance, lived in their own lives, whether at work or play. We **serve** others as Jesus showed in the example of his life and death. We **strive** to live out God's justice and peace in our world, in our specific context.

These are big promises, yes. But they are promises that we all make, at whatever age, with the gift of God's strength and the bold affirmation of the assembly —our promises!— backing them up.

One connection that we can make is that the promises that our young folks make at confirmation reflect the mission of the church. We are a church "In Mission for Others." What does this mean? What's the point? The point is that we live, we hear, we proclaim, we serve & strive. (EVANGELICAL LUTHERAN WORSHIP, page 236.)

Bottom line: We make a concerted effort to worship together, to learn from God's word and from one another, to serve each other and to live each day seeking and promoting God's love in our world.



As our confirmands make promises this fall, I would extend to all a special invitation to join them and to uphold them with *our* promises. That's Sunday, November 7, at 9:30 am. Their witness will have unfolded on October 31. Let's support one another. Let's make our various promises thereby saying "yes" to God's call in our own lives.

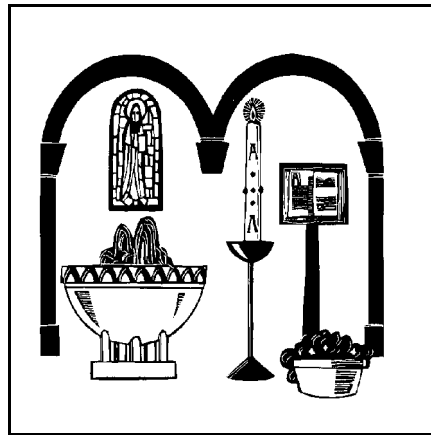

+ Intern Support Team

Trinity's new internship program has begun to unfold beautifully. While Trinity is no stranger to internships, it has been many years.

A History of Innovation

In my early years, the internship program served as a bridge from a single called pastor—who worked with various pastoral assistants including Henry Opperman, Luther Eberhardt and Alfred Wedman—to two called pastors. Our interns have included Marty Tuer, Rick Shore, Dave Whynot, and Mike Buckley. As well, other pastors have assisted in our ministry over the years including Betty Pugh, Bob Kelly and Helen Toman. A number of seminary placement students have also been part of our pastoral leadership team.

Pastoral Leadership Team

Today, we have two called pastors—one functioning full time (Anne Anderson) and one functioning half-time (André Lavergne)—together with a half-time intern (Jennifer Famme), and two pastors offering regular preaching (Bob Thaler) and additional pastoral visitation (Helen Toman). So while the model has evolved over the years, internship is not new to the mix.

Intern Support Team

Recently, an Intern Support Team was created to provide support to Vicar Jennifer. While Pastor Anne is the supervising pastor, the Intern Support Team is composed of three lay people who meet quarterly to provide feedback and a nurturing environment in which our intern may reflect on her experience. The team is made up of Michel Gascon, Betty Murray and Chris Normandeau.

The team will soon gather for the first time. At present, Pastor Anne meets with Vicar Jennifer every week. That will likely go to every two weeks once the internship is well established and Jennifer and Anne are comfortable in their new roles.

• Every month, Council sends a number of thank-you notes. This month, we thanked Ernie & Betty Ritz and Dee Radke for their tremendous work on our Anniversary Cookbook; Pam Olayemi & Chris Leonhardt for singing at worship; Christine Wuerscher for preaching and joining us for our ongoing anniversary celebrations.

• Pastor André offered the final (six of six) in-service session on Lutheran worship. He talked about the Psalms and music broadly. In conclusion, he advanced three principles which inform Trinity's worship: (1) We do what is welcoming. (2) We do what we must do (directive rubrics) in an ecumenically recognizable pattern which includes gathering, word, meal and sending ("The Ordo"). (3) We do what we do well.

• Much of the September meeting was spent reviewing and introducing our extensive fall program, the broadest we have offered in years. Mention was made of the wonderful sense of

community and warmth we experienced on Backpack Sunday.

• Our Life-long Learning Plan sees us contemplating a new Open Table series for this fall and a Sunday morning pastor-led series for Lent, 2011.

• We are in good financial shape as reported in last month's TRINITY DOVE. In October, we'll begin work on a 2011 program budget. At length, we'll also begin to contemplate possible 2011 Endowment Fund expenditures for recommendation to the congregation at the February 13, 2011, annual meeting.

• Trinity's energy-conservation Capital projects are concluding with a view to having an inspection by the end of October and rebates in-hand toward the end of this year or early in 2011.

• A congratulatory letter to St. Peter's Lutheran Church, New Hamburg, re their 100th anniversary, was circulated.

• A "There will be Cake" Sunday is on the calendar for January 2 to celebrate the many years of wonderful ministry offered by Florence Sebert.

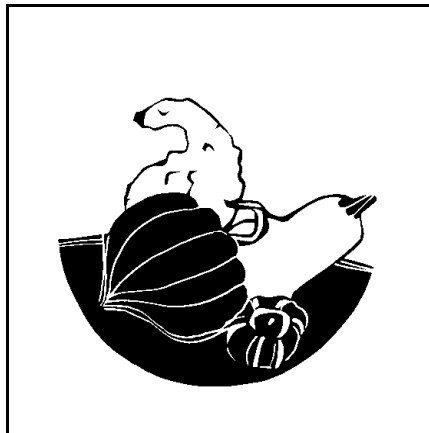

General and Capital Funds

As indicated last month, both funds are in excellent shape. The General Fund benefits from our staff reconfiguration and reallocation of resources to cover our reconfigured Pastoral Leadership Team (see page 4). Offerings in the General Fund are lagging slightly those of last year. If you have gotten behind, and as you are able, please review your financial stewardship to date.

The year-to-date deficit in the Capital Fund is covered by an accumulated surplus (as was budgeted at the annual meeting) and by still-to-come government rebates for our energy conservation work.



Transfers ~ CLWR

With respect to the Transfers, the disasters in Haiti and Pakistan have seen Trinity contributions to Canadian Lutheran World Relief total some \$18,000, year to date. This is a remarkable achievement by any standard. Many throughout the world will benefit from Trinity's generosity. Other transfer items include the TYGers, ELW, pastors' discretionary fund, and so on.
