Grace and peace to you.

Pheww! Is it almost time for fall already? It feels like our summer has flown past with convention and camp and a little time at the cottage. It was a good summer but it felt like it was here and gone in the blink of an eye.

This August, as we gathered for Council, we spoke of how we are in place for movement: we are ready to move from *welcome* to *invitation*. Why?

Well, I think we do *welcome* pretty good! I often see folks welcoming newcomers and we try our best to have our doors open and to serve our community with the gifts we have been given. Now we have an opportunity to move from our great *welcome* to *invitation*.

As I get ready for Back-to-Church Sunday, I am struck by the question Michael Harvey asks as we get set to invite our friends and family to church.

He asks, "Are you a *host* or a *guest* at your church?" Just as you would offer a friend a seat and a cup of coffee if they came to your house, will you welcome someone to church in the same way?

I think Harvey is right. We do need to take ownership for the ministry of our church and what we offer. We need to offer an invitation in personal ways, whether we greet folks at church or greet them on the street. Trinity is *our* community. Whether we worship or come to adult learning or attend a program or serve in some other way, this is *our* community. All of us can offer a personal invitation to those around us who might need to hear that they too are loved and welcome in this community.

There are some good things happening, these days. Erika Mueller, our youth worker is excited about working with our young people. A search for a new minister of music is underway and Bob Marshall, our fantastic interim musician, is keeping us singing! We have a supper planned for the Pfenning's guest workers and we're thinking about the possibility of beginning a new program for young families called "Messy Church".

We are good at seeking out where God is calling us to be in new places and new ways. I would encourage us all to look for ways we can share the invitation and welcome we have known to God's unconditional and warm embrace in the community of Trinity Church, New Hamburg.

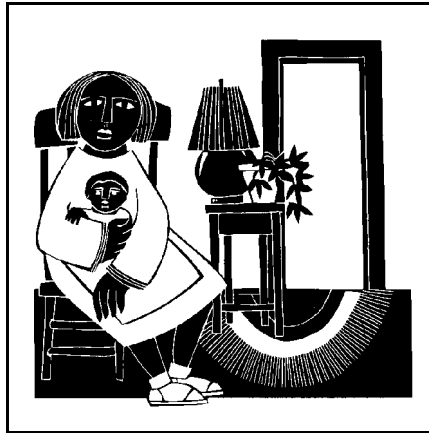

+ Mission-Shaped Ministry

Trinity is the idea of "Messy Church." (We didn't invent that name!)

Messy Church is a form of worship that happens once a month in a large open space such as Trinity Hall. It's an opportunity for adults and children to enjoy expressing their creativity together, to gather for a meal, to experience worship and to have fun within a church context. *Messy Church* was born in the Church of England and is happening in various communities across Canada. Meet Bob Marshall

On August 31, our Minister of Music Task Group met to flesh out the interview and auditions process for our applicants for the position of *Minister of Music* at Trinity Church. The next morning, September 1, I met with Bob Marshall for the first time since Gywin's retirement. (Anne was at camp for the week.) Bob and I are beginning to get to know each other and, together with Anne, are beginning to shape our fall worship program.

On Sunday, September 4, Bob Marshall led our music for the first time. Bob

brings many years of experience teaching music, playing for and supporting congregational worship, and leading choirs.

Bob is serving as Trinity's *Interim Parish Musician*. That means that Bob will be staffing both worship services and will be rehearsing and directing our Affirmation Singers and Trinity Choir. Working with both pastors, Bob is responsible for maintaining our music program until the arrival of our new *Minister of Music*.

Indeed, Bob's responsibilities foreshadow our expectations for Trinity's new *Minister of Music*. Our design for this position is of someone who offers a clear vision for ministry, works as part of our pastoral leadership team, and is comfortable leading music —whether playing the organ or piano or directing our choirs and other soloists— for both our Sanctuary and Anchor Communities. (The *Job Posting* and *Position Description* appear on Trinity's website. We'll be conducting interviews, etc., into October.)

Thanks for Camp Edgewood ~ This summer, we had a fantastic week at Edgewood. We had thirty young people attend as campers and veteran campers. We gathered with youth and leaders from nine other churches in South-Western Ontario. Our theme, this year, was "be different".

We talked about how God has called us as followers to live in God's love as we serve and love our community. We had sessions with four different pastoral teams which included hiking, a convention simulation, artwork, videos, skits and small group conversation.

Trinity's Kim Schwartz joined us as our camp nurse and we were very thankful for her ministry of healing. (We were also very glad for her clean-cabin checking!) She was a great presence with our youth and with the pastoral team.

Christina Flood, upon retrieving her sons from camp, wrote on Facebook: "Jacob and Montana would like to thank you,

and ALL the volunteers who made Camp a super fun time AGAIN! We heard stories the WHOLE way home and they still have smiles on their faces from the fantastic memories. THANKS, Pastor Anne, for always going out of your way to make the kids feel at home and so special."

I think fantastic ministry happens at Edgewood. Our young people have a chance to get to know one-another in new ways; they gain friendships; they explore faith topics; and they begin to take on faith practices for themselves. This time together is invaluable.

At Trinity, young people who are starting grades seven and eight in the fall attend the week of camp as *campers*. We also invite older youth to return as *veteran campers* where the focus is on their leadership skills leading up to possibly becoming counselors down the road.

Overview

Our General Fund shows a declining deficit. Our General Fund expenditures are well within budget.

Our Capital Fund is in good shape but will be severely depleted (as will the opening balance of \$23,737) when work on the roof (about \$29,000) and the installation of a new phone system (about \$4,400) are completed and taken into account.

Our Transfers include \$11,169 for the terrific Gywin Murray Church Music Scholarship (to be administered by the Eastern Synod) and \$9,571 for Canadian Lutheran World Relief (mostly recent Horn of Africa Appeal).
