✚ Pastor André ~ By the Numbers

Grace and peace to you.

It's often observed that we live in a world of numbers. Numbers can serve as a short form and their mere mention, even apart from that which they quantify, can help us to bring to mind something important. Consider 5000. Or 12. Or 40. How about 175 or 100? You get the picture. Sometimes people ask about the dimensions of Trinity's ministry. Often, they're looking for numbers. Here are a few!

Trinity Church: 1000 persons in 300 families over 500 listings. There are about a thousand people who would look for ministry in a time of crisis such as a death. These people comprise some 300 families. That said, we attempt to track our young adults, who are frequently in transition—coming, going, bouncing—separately. Hence we have about 300 families in 500 family and individual listings.

TRINITY DOVE: 500 copies a month. Everybody gets one, whether it's sent to where the home fires burn or where life has begun to lead. That has been our commitment for 25 years! About 125 copies of TRINITY DOVE go out electronically. That's one in four! The rest (about 375) go out as "hard copy". People are welcome to either or both.

E-mail: Of our 500 or so listings, about 400 of these families/individuals (or 80%) have e-mail. Of the 400 with e-mail, we have managed to gather email addresses for over 300. That's three out of four and the number is growing every day! Not bad, huh?

Photo Album: As I write, Buck has booked some 750 people in 280 sittings. That is a terrific result. Moreover, the endeavour is an every-four-year opportunity to bring our parish records up to date. It's especially helpful in sorting out the above-mentioned coming, going and bouncing which makes the difference between paying attention to the 300 and paying attention to the 500.

So there's a bit of a snap-shot of Trinity by the numbers. And remember: we do our best to keep our records up to date. However, people have to let us know when there's a change in circumstance: a kid leaving home, people pairing-up or expecting an addition to the family. Some weeks ago, we placed a parish listing in the narthex for people to review. Any bugs? Please let us know!

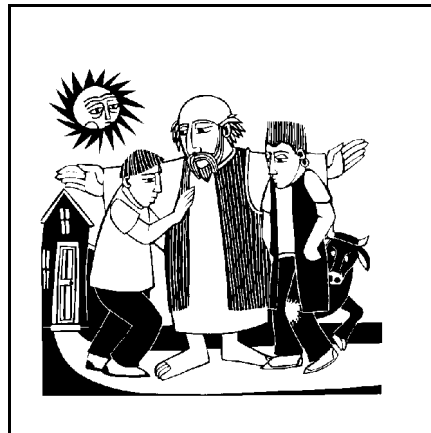

Brunch

She got into the brunch buffet line behind the young couple with the curly-haired little boy, seated on his father's arm. She smiled to herself as the child's parents explained what foods were on offer and asked him what he would like. When he opted for more pancakes than were prudent, his mother gently but firmly sidetracked him in the direction of the cantaloupe; clearly she knew what a well-balanced lunch should look like.

The older woman helped herself to scrambled eggs, a potato pancake, some fruit, and took them back to her table and ate absently, reading the Sunday paper, keeping half an eye and ear on the young family, seated at the next table. She heard how engaged both parents were with the child, how they treated him with steady affection and courtesy, listening to him and responding, and again she smiled to herself.

On her way back to the buffet for toast, she stopped very briefly at the family's table and said, "Forgive me for intruding, but I just wanted to tell you that you're doing a fabulous job of parenting."

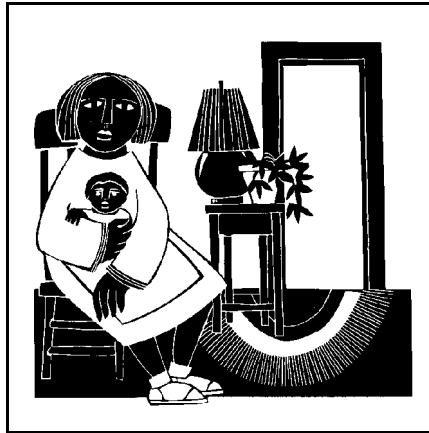
"Why, thank you!" the young mother said. The father smiled. The child gave the woman a wide-eyed curious look. Returning with her toast, she was careful not to intrude on them again.

It was something she'd started to do of late: to praise good parenting wherever she saw it. This was because she was always aware of the wonderful power of a really bad example.

When her own kids were small, she'd taken quite a lot of flak from others on her parenting practices. She was, they said, too soft on her kids. (The fact that her most severe critics had less than stellar track records in the parenting biz was something she tried not to mention.) Kids need rough treatment to toughen them up, she'd heard over and over again. The kid is being bullied? Teach him to turn and pound the other guy into applesauce. Somewhat wearily, she'd ignored the criticisms and had done what she thought best, which was generally counter-cultural.

But it was hard, bucking all the pressure, and she often

questioned whether or not her choices were the right ones, given the family circumstances, which were difficult. Only of late, as her now-adult kids began to come into their own, was she beginning to feel more certain that she had, in fact, done pretty much the best a parent could. And so now she praises good parenting whenever she sees it, in the supermarket, in places like this restaurant, trying not to be weird or intrusive, but giving the reassurance of a veteran. She drops the praise in a few words and smiles and walks away, minding her own business. She was into the book review section when she became aware that someone was standing by her table. A little apprehensive, she looked up and saw the young mother. Had she given offence? She stood, a little uncertain.



"I just wanted to let you know," the mother said, "that your words meant a lot to me." She sniffed slightly, took off her glasses, wiped her eyes. "In fact, they made me cry."

The older woman spoke softly of the decisions she'd had to make, how so many of them meant rejecting what the culture said mattered —how, for example, she had insisted on letting her kids have dream-time instead of forcing them into accomplishments that didn't interest them.

How the only way to raise courteous adults is to model courtesy to your kids.

How children who know themselves to be well-loved will, in the end, come out okay.

The young mother told the older woman that she, too, is never sure that what she's doing is the best thing for her son. Others advise her to be tougher with him; others treat their own children without respect or courtesy, as though being under the age of six means never having to hear "I'm sorry." And she has no veteran mothers to talk to, nobody to advise. Only her own instincts.

Go with your gut, the older woman told her. "And when in doubt, cuddle. That's what I always did."

"May I have a hug?" the girl said.

"Of course."

So that's why I was supposed to be here, the older woman thought to herself, watching the young family leave. To leave those words with them. She smiled to herself and got on with the paper.

Every month, Krista Durrer, our secretary, sends a number of thank-you notes to people named in the pastor's report, a continuing tradition for 25 years. This month, we thanked Lori Arnott (for her leadership and grace in the various transitions surrounding Pastor Anne's and Pastor André's ministries & leaves) and Lotus Hammer (for her ministry of hospitality around funerals) and Heidi Ziegler, Scott Malloch, Tara Otto, Trevor Anderson, Megan Clarke & Kirsten Danner (for their terrific leadership and support for our Affirmation Camping program).

- Bill Lindner is exploring repairs and a service schedule for Trinity's main heating system.

- Council received a comprehensive Pastors' Report on the breadth of Trinity's ministry. We are in terrific shape for fall and have much for which to be grateful.

- Council received updates from our Stewardship & Anniversary Task Groups. They have worked very hard through the summer to insure a firm footing for fall and beyond.

- Council was informed that Pastor Lavergne will be on medical leave beginning August 27. The Mutual Ministry Team is confident that our fall ministries are in good shape and that Pastor Anderson will be well supported.

- In response to a number of questions from Jo Knackstedt, Pastor Lavergne is designing a series of mini-sessions for a Council study on Lutheran worship. He and Pastor Anderson will offer the series over some six or so consecutive Council meetings, likely beginning in late fall.

The series will look at (1) a changing church and how we've gotten where we are and (2) Trinity's vision for ministry and why we do what we do. The series will dove-tail nicely with the realities of a *faithful journey* in a church *in mission for others*. Additionally, the series may serve as a model for future adult learning sessions in late 2010 or early 2011.
